Campus Outreach and Disciple Making

Abstract:

In obedience to Jesus' Great Commission (Mt 28:18-20), we have focused on making disciples of Jesus among college students. Traditional "campus fishing" and 1:1 or group Bible study, reflection writing & sharing approach still remains as our primary method. New approaches have also been tried and tested across the UBF community worldwide. In this Interest Group, we will discuss the challenges and opportunities that we are facing today as well as share some success stories and advices related to our campus outreach and disciple making ministry. Specific topics to be covered in this session include, but are not limited to the followings.

- Ways to invite students to Bible study
- Sharing the gospel with students on campus today
- Effective Bible study materials
- Success stories of disciple making
- From disciples to disciple-makers (reproducers)
- Serving campus mission as a small house church
- Campus outreach and disciple making in cross-cultural setting (as missionaries)
- How to evangelize the whole campus in collaboration with other Christian clubs
- Significance of disciple maker's continual spiritual growth

Gospel Centered Community

Abstract:

We are called to the body of Jesus Christ and live out the kingdom of God in our community. How can we build a gospel-centered community? How can we bear Christ's image in our community? How can we overcome disharmony and conflicts and build a body of Christ together? This interest group aims to discuss this critical topic and gain insights from presentations, case studies, and discussions.

The Gospel Centered Community interest group consists of three sub-sessions. The first session introduces and delves into the meaning of the gospel centered community (40 minutes). Presentations will touch upon the biblical background of gospel centered community and share the discernments to cultivate Christ-centered community. The sharing will also include the principles and processes of formative community revolving around Jesus' grace and mission.

The second session will bring a few examples to light in the form of case studies (40 minutes). The case study presenters will share some success and failure stories with the participants and cast questions about the challenges and opportunities in building a gospel centered community.

Lastly, the third session will involve the participants to break into groups and engage them in discussions (80 minutes). Main questions will be given to each group, and the groups will immerse themselves into prayerful, honest and reflective discourses with each other. One leader will be designated for each group, and the leader is encouraged to present the findings at the end of breakout session. The question and answer time will follow.

The interest group will end with united prayers by small groups (20 minutes). We will pray to God for imparting his humility, intervention, and wisdom to us based on the prayer topics discovered throughout the presentations and discussions.

Abstract:

This Interest Group (IG) will give the audience/participants a few suggestions/guidance to flourish the house church ministry. First, participants will have a good deal of general information about the house church; the history, positive aspects, and even vision of house church ministry. Second, participants can have an understanding of how to handle and overcome emotional difficulties in a house church ministry such as loneliness and isolation to keep the UBF identity. Third, participants will be shared with a couple of examples to overcome loneliness and isolation problems through cooperation with other neighbor house church ministries. Fourth, even without cooperation with other house churches, there is a suggestion of successful ministry of house church. Fifth, on the top of above, there will be additional suggestions/discussions to flourish a house church ministry in this group; the importance of keeping the faith as a missionary, benefits of constant Bible Study and prayers, and a wonderful chance of spiritual growth in having a house church ministry and so on.

Abstract:

Every international organization faces the realities of cross-cultural communication. Too often, we proceed with ministry as though we are in our own home settings, thinking that the means we used will work just well in the new country as they did in our own. What are critical factors we need to consider in order to minister well when we cross into new cultures? What might the Bible have to say about cultural differences and values? How can we raise native leaders more effectively? What is the best timing, process, preparation for leadership transition? In this session, we will explore these questions with the intention of giving participants insights into their own ministry so that they may be more effective evangelizing, discipling and passing the leadership to those among whom they minister.

How to help the next generation to be the leaders of our church?

Abstract:

UBF has been a campus ministry from its onset in 1961. Many people have become Jesus' disciples while they were on campus and committed their lives to campus mission. As they grow older, they establish house churches and have children. The number of 2nd and 3rd generations is rapidly growing in our community throughout the world. They have great talents and potential to be leaders of our church. How can we help the next generation to be the leaders of our church?

Discipling our children as they go through high school and college is very important. We tend to pay less attention to them while serving others. We often take it for granted that our children are a part of our ministry. But many 2nd gens do not find their identity in our church and leave for other communities. What is the current status in UBF with regard to raising the next generation as Jesus' disciples? How many 2nd gens and 3rd gens are there in UBF? What percentage of them are becoming the leaders of our church? How can we help them to find their identity in our ministry and grow as the leaders of our church? This IG session is dedicated to finding answers to these important questions. Many success stories and practical implementations will be shared in this session. We will also review how the Jewish education to learn from them how they pass the identity as God's chosen people on to the next generation.

Abstract

The objective of this session is to strengthen UBF core values of 1:1 Bible study and shepherding by introducing Biblical counseling materials, training and resources. Everyone who is serious about learning 1:1 Bible study, shepherding, and ministry through counseling is welcome. Biblical counseling can be defined as shepherding through spiritual discipline and Biblical friendship. We do this because we are called to instruct one another in knowledge and goodness (Romans 15:14).

In part 1, we want to introduce “life through the lens of Scripture.” The goal is to help people see others and problems through Scripture and find solutions to human suffering and sin. Some testimonials and case studies on various topics will be presented.

In part 2, we will think about how we can strengthen 1:1 Bible study and our ministry through Biblical counseling. Practical ministry experiences (challenges and suggestions) will be presented followed by Q&A. Biblical counseling study materials, resources, and training programs will also be introduced.

Praise and Worship

Abstract:

What is worship? Too often, worship is defined as what we do when we gather on Sunday. Particularly, the singing part of Sunday gathering almost became the definition of worship in this generation. In this session, we will provide the holistic biblical description of worship and the principles of worship gatherings. A significant portion of the session will be based on 'Engaging with God: A biblical theology of worship' by David Peterson. Also, several local chapter praise and worship members will share their practical experiences and comments as applications of such biblical foundations.

Topic 1. Biblical understanding of worship - Sometimes, the disputes on how our worship service should look like can be 'hot'. Unfortunately, however, often the opinions regard only the style of worship service and they are based on personal experiences. A sound biblical understanding of worship can offer a solid common ground in our discussions on the worship service. Our life as a Jesus' disciple will also be positively influenced by the Biblical understanding of worship. The quality of Monday-Friday life, personal devotion, sanctification, and some other elements in the disciples' life depend on whether or not we understand and practice worship properly. Overall, the church and Jesus' disciples really need to know what the Bible says about worship.

Topic 2. Principles of worship gatherings - Though worship can happen anywhere at any moment in our lives, worship at church gatherings is the climax of worship. What are the biblically informed guidelines of designing and practicing church worship services or gatherings? It is crucial for the pastor and worship leaders to be well equipped with such understandings, as they design and lead the services and gatherings. It will honor God and build up Christ's body.

We would like to invite three groups of people who may be interested in this Interest Group: (1) UBF praise and worship team members at local chapters, (2) local chapter directors/pastors responsible for designing and leading worship services, and (3) Bible students/shepherds interested in worship. We pray that this Interest Group may raise an awareness of the importance of worship and accelerate the networking of praise and worship teams in our UBF community.

Pastoring and preaching from a lay perspective

Abstract:

How can a lay preacher effectively prepare a sermon and preach week after week when balancing the constraints of his family, job, and other church responsibilities? This IG will delve into that question by looking at some of the special challenges that face lay preachers as they pastor their homes and their flocks with God's Word. It will also exam some of the unique blessing and opportunities that come with being a lay pastor.

The session will include topics on the differences between full time pastors, bi-vocational pastors, and lay pastors. It will also present some of the pros and cons of one on one ministry and counseling in the context of being a lay pastor, and how lay pastors and preachers can best serve their families and flocks with limited time and resources.

Special emphasis will be placed on time management, personal discipline, organizational habits, communication skills, administrative tasks, sermon preparation, pastoral ministry, and leveraging technology. The session will dive into best practices when it comes it preparing a sermon, building a home library, making use of commentaries, and recommended resources for those in lay ministry. Additional topics will include balancing family and ministry, with a holistic view of the family as being part of one's ministry.

This session is designed primarily for lay preachers who are struggling to improve their messages and ministry with a desire to connect with others who are also serving in this special calling, but full time pastors will also find the session useful as well.

Abstract:

We live in the age of the Holy Spirit that our sons and daughters will prophesy, our young men will see visions, our old men will dream dreams. Abstract:

Right before his glorious ascension, our Lord Jesus gave us the Great Commission: “Therefore go and make disciples of all nation...” (Mt 28:19a). God so loved the world that he gave his one and only son. He really wants to save all people of the world and bring them to the Kingdom of God. In order to fulfill this Great Commission, God poured out his Spirit on all people and said, “...your old men will dream dreams” (Acts 2:17c). ABSTRACT.

The greatest virtues God gives to those who follow Jesus are three: faith, hope and love (1 Cor. 13:13). But the greatest of these is plainly said to be love. Why? Love is the greatest virtue since it alone perfectly reflects the eternal character of God the Trinity because “God is love” (1 John 4:8, 16). But love is perhaps the most misunderstood word in the Bible and our everyday language. This is because love is death on a cross. And love is resurrection life empowering us as the church to reflect the divine nature to the whole world.

In this session, the panel of facilitators will draw from Dr. John Armstrong’s book, *Costly Love* (2017), and explore how costly love is the foundation of ministry that leads us to build missional partnerships for His Kingdom. First, Dr. John Armstrong ([Founder of ACT3](#)) will share what a life of costly love entails and show how and why he wrote his book, *Costly Love*, to make this grand biblical theme clear for all disciples of Jesus. Second, Barnabas Lin ([InterVarsity Christian Fellowship](#)) will share the vision of the Urbana ’18 conference and how this ministry mobilizes a network of mission organizations to equip young people to practice costly love among the nations. 칭의와 성화가 구별되지 않을 때 행위구원론의 오류나, 구원파와 같은 방종주의로 나갈 수 있다. 또한 구원은 믿음, 성화는 인간의 노력과 열심의 원리로 착각하여 신앙생활의 한계에 부딪힐 수 있다. 작은 문제가 아니다. 신앙의 형태를 결정하여 신앙의 한계와 혼란에 직면하거나, 동역에 있어서 갈등문제를 야기할 수 있다. 본 인터레스트 그룹에서는 구원론에 있어서 칭의와 성화와의 관계를 설명함으로써 UBF 구성원들이 올바른 신앙관을 갖도록 돕고자 한다.
